## Forms

## Payment

Payment is due at time of registration.

## Cancellation

If you enroll in class and your plans change, or you have concerns about your child attending camp this summer, you can receive a full refund/credit for camp tuition, less registration fee. Program change request must be received 2 weeks prior to enrolled camp week start date. Participants who do not attend their registered camp week, or who do not contact us to cancel two weeks prior to start date, will not receive a refund or credit. By submitting your payment, you are agreeing to the policy outlined above.

## Lunch

Students should bring their own lunch to camp. Parents may drop off lunch or students will be provided an emergency lunch and charged \$7.00.

## Medication Policy

Upon completion of the registration selection for your student, you will receive an email to fill out and return the Medical Information Release Form. Medication Policy and information will be provided in the form.

## Drop Off/ Pick Up Policy: Release of Students

No persons except the parents or legal guardians, persons with written permission from parents or legal guardians as indicated on this registration form in the Emergency Contact and Authorized Pick Up section, and law enforcement officers* will be permitted to withdraw or take any student away from school. If anyone appears at the School Office, other than a law officer, with a divorce decree or legal document that states otherwise, the parent and/or legal guardian will be contacted immediately.
*As required by law, this provision extends to U.S. Marshals, immigration officers, County Sheriffs, constables, or any of their duly appointed deputies, arson investigators, police juvenile officers, County Child Welfare workers, and all other law enforcement and/or peace officers acting in their respective official capacity.
No child will be released to a parent or guardian if School personnel believe the person to be impaired (ie., inebriated or otherwise under the influence of a controlled substance) and, therefore, unable to care for the child.
